Chair Aila stated there were 62 public testimonies received by the Friday deadline. There were six late testimonies and two petitions forwarded by Senator Favella. All testimonies were uploaded to the Commission's cloud folder.

Commissioner Awo stated that he requested a special meeting because the Governor said he does not support gambling in Hawai'i the day after the Commission voted. Given Governor Ige's recent public statements that he is opposed to gambling in Hawai'i, and therefore not likely to make it part of his Legislative Packet, he requested a special meeting to provide Commissioners an opportunity to renew discussions and further decision-making by examining and evaluating essential information not disclosed prior to voting on Item C-1.

He felt the Department had a fiduciary duty to disclose that kind of vital information before the Commission voted. He added that his request was not intended to divide the Commission. Whether it was yes or no, every Commissioner who voted acted in good faith to support our beneficiary communities based on what they believe to be correct. All available information should be provided to the Commission as part of its deliberation. Since that was not provided, he asked for a special meeting. He wanted to offer context for his request.

Commissioner Teruya asked if meeting minutes are prepared for the Commission's executive sessions. Deputy AG Kanaka'ole stated the Commission Secretary prepares minutes for each session. The minutes may be protected depending on the discussion and other factors like whether it is part of active litigation.

Commissioner Teruya asked if the Legislature can ask for executive session minutes of this discussion. Deputy AG Kanaka'ole stated the discussion would probably be covered under attorney-client privilege because it is active. There is likely to be continuing deliberation at the Legislature on the policy issue. They could make the request, but it is likely not to be released at this time.

Commissioner Helm thanked Commissioner Awo for his comments.

#### MOTION/ACTION

Moved by Commissioner Awo, seconded by Commissioner Helm to convene in an executive session pursuant to Section 92-5(a)(4), HRS, to consult with its attorney on questions and issue pertaining to the Commission's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities. Motion carried unanimously.
